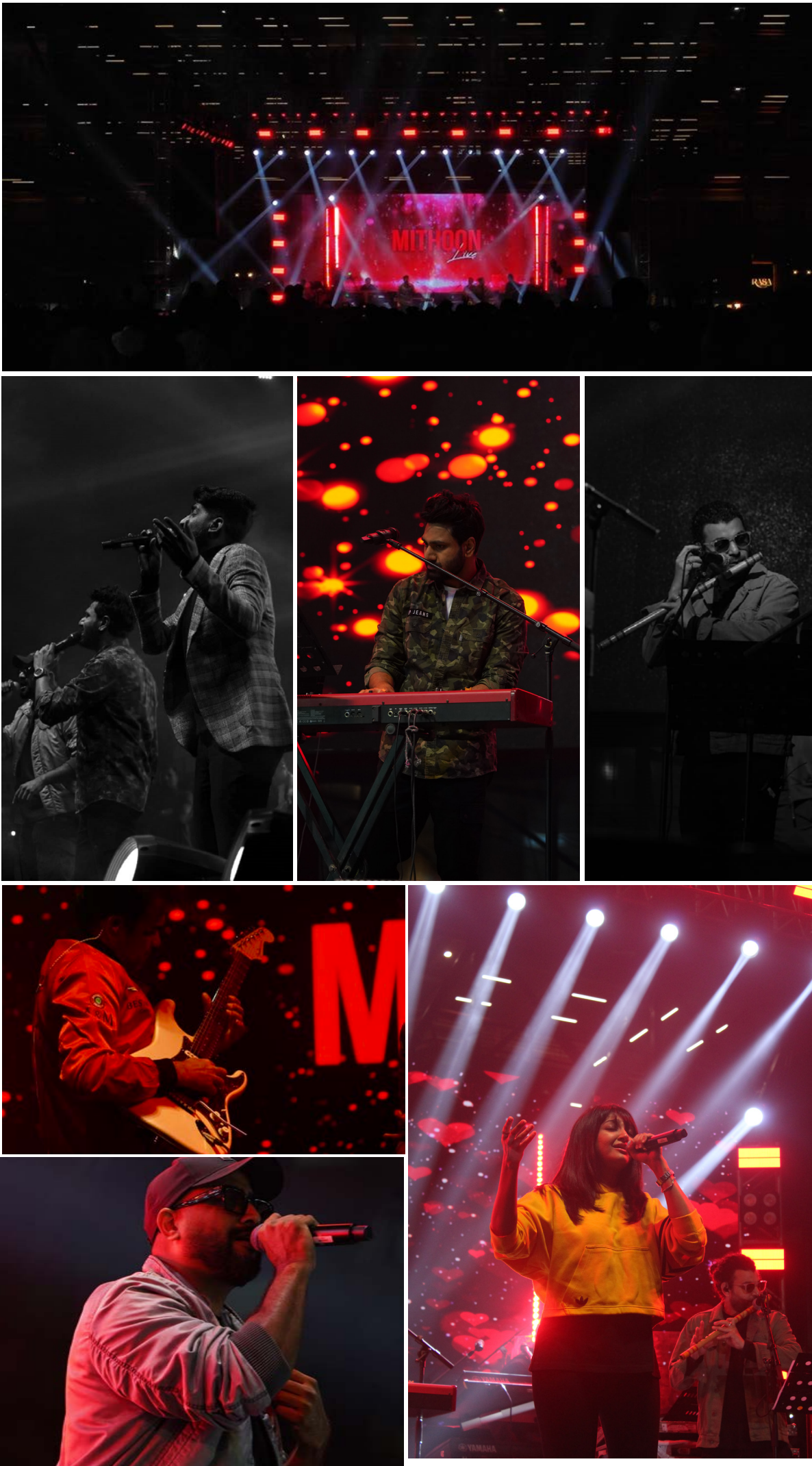


This success is a testament to the hard work, dedication, and sportsmanship exhibited by the athletes of JGU
