

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



Mock Niti Aayog: This committee saw participants stepping into the shoes of Chief Ministers to discuss significant agendas, including One Nation, One Election, the Delimitation Plan (2026), and the Women Safety Policy.

Indian Constitutional Quiz: Adding a competitive edge, the Indian Constitutional Quiz challenged participants in a multi-round format.
