Over 15 dedicated volunteers gathered at the Crossover Commons, the place where food stalls were installed, to clear waste and restore the space to its original state.

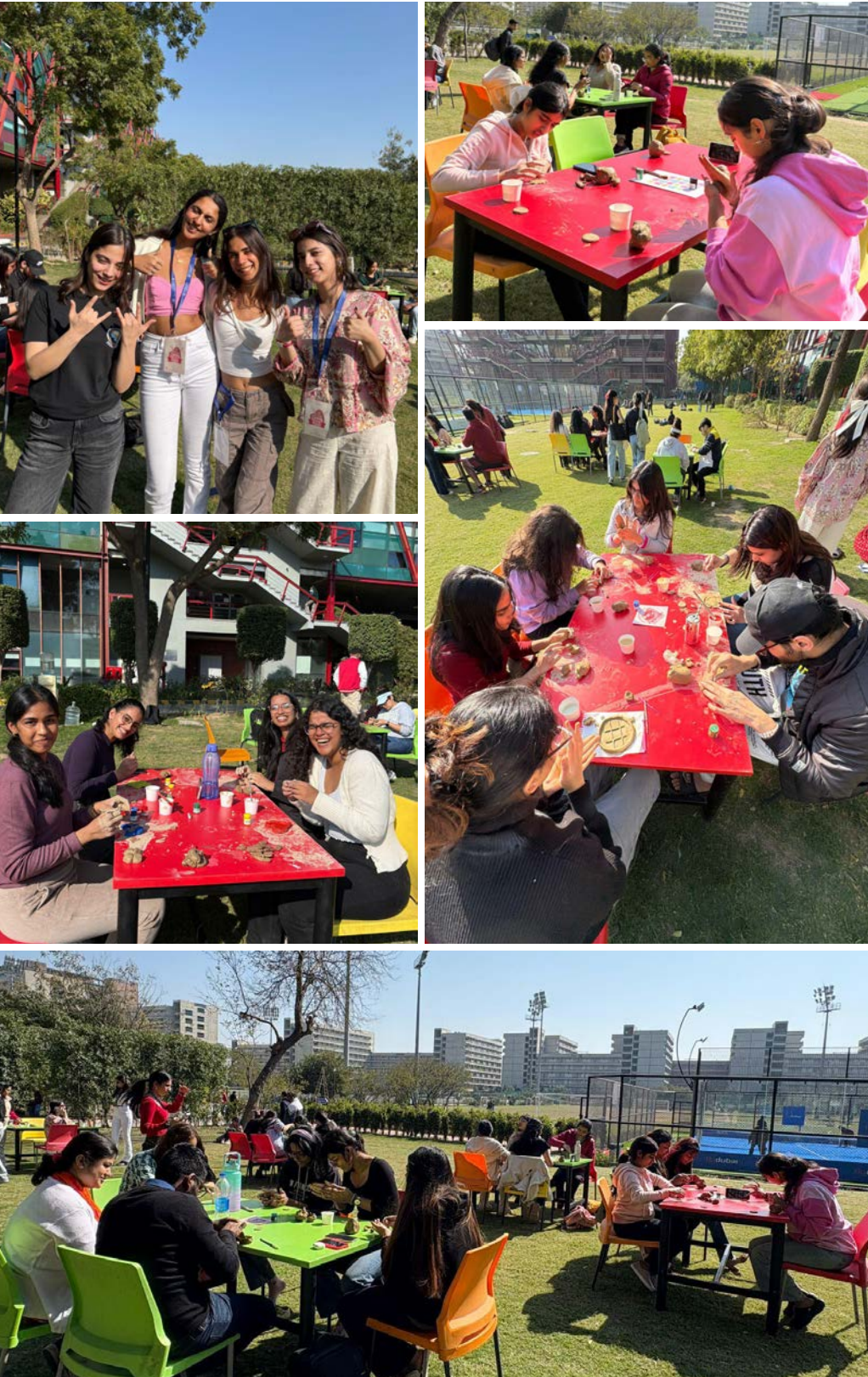
