## About the Speaker

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Mr. Anand Pawar is the Executive Director of SAMYAK, an NGO based in Pune, India. He is a male gender trainer and an activist involved with women's and men's groups working towards gender equality and a violence-free society. He is also an active member of the South Asian Network to Address Masculinities (SANAM) and one of the Asia Board members of the Women's Peace Maker Programme (WPP). Having travelled extensively international borders, he has served as a consultant to many INGOs and developmental agencies including several UN agencies. Development of communication materials on gender, men and masculinities is his specific area of interest. Mr. Pawar is involved in conceptualising and contextualising gender trainings with different groups and plays a key role in engaging with other social justice movements to locate issues of men and masculinities within movements. He was also associated with various qualitative research initiatives, exploring issues around gender, men and masculinities in India.

## About Breakthrough-the organisation and Introduction to the Workshop

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Breakthrough is an international human rights organisation working on a range of issues. In 2001, Breakthrough started working and resolved to grab the issue of gender-based violence by its collar with a music album called Mann Ke Manjeere. The album became a video. The video became a campaign and the campaign slowly built itself into a movement. Women, men, villagers, city-slickers, government and corporates; Breakthrough has invited everyone into the growing discourse on gender equity.

With 'Mission Hazaar' Breakthrough is trying to make the women around us – in our homes, schools, colleges, market places, streets, and public places – visible.
