**SDG 1:** NO POVERTY

END POVERTY IN ALL ITS FORMS EVERYWHERE

JGU's scholarships serve as an important tool to ensure quality higher education accessible. This report portrays JGU's commitment and efforts to provide affordable global education in India through financial assistance to students. The university offers all economic and social classes equal opportunity for employment in the institution. The university encourages persons from the neighbouring villages to apply for jobs within the campus which include unskilled, semi-skilled and skilled jobs. Women in general are encouraged to apply and have been provided employment within the institution. The university has taken care of the children by providing them the crèche facility as well. The university has adopted the norms as per the government of India and the International Labour Organization (ILO) guidelines in recruitment processes and welfare measures provided to its personnel for all cadres. These efforts will indeed benefit in creation of employment and work generation which will be a major step towards poverty alleviation.

The university has taken steps for providing sustainable, nutritious and affordable food choices on campus by facilitating food production and introducing measures to reduce food wastage on campus itself. We emphasise balanced menus that include a variety of fruits, vegetables, whole grains, lean proteins, and plant-based options. Our chefs and nutritionists work together to ensure that everyone has access to wholesome and flavorful meals. The university has an association with a company duly approved by the Haryana State Pollution Control Board to collect the waste food and use it as per the guiding principles of the Board. JGU is supporting farming activities outside the campus within a radius of 2 kms and offering support to the farmers in terms of equipment, technical training programmes, etc. Being a not-for-profit entity, the university has been conducting philanthropic activities as its CSR activities which includes various community activities with the local villagers around the university campus.

The university provides all within the campus with 24x7 medical facilities and access to ambulances at all times. Basic health and mental well-being of any human being is of utmost priority for the university. The university has a no-smoking campus which helps promote the health and sanity of the sustainable environment of the university campus. The aim of the university is to provide access to affordable health and wellbeing services on campus by conducting well-being programmes to reduce incidence of communicable diseases and promote mental health. The Health Centre has an in-house laboratory setup, allowing for convenient and efficient in-house, free testing services to students, faculty, staff, workers and their family members. This ensures quick and accurate diagnosis, enabling prompt medical intervention when required.



## **SDG 4:** QUALITY EDUCATION

ENSURE INCLUSIVE & EQUITABLE QUALITY EDUCATION AND PROMOTE LIFELONG LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL

The university provides world-class education. The financial assistance programmes of the university has helped it draw students from all sections of the society. The university has brought faculty from different countries and regions around the world, has drawn students from different countries and has collaborated with several hundred leading institutions around the world to bring international experiences to the Indian higher education system. The university aims at improving inclusive education process on a periodic basis by creating its own benchmarks and challenging its own achievements. The university also endeavours to support vulnerable and disadvantaged people to access and participate fully in the university, including differently abled persons, indigenous peoples, and people experiencing financial difficulty. The university is also conducting various programmes including scholarships and financial assistance schemes to enhance literacy and education in communities and schools in the university's local area and beyond, which will indeed promote and encourage inclusivity in learning.



### **SDG 5:** GENDER EQUALITY

#### ACHIEVE GENDER EQUALITY & EMPOWER ALL WOMEN AND GIRLS

The university is in continuous engagement with the local community women to promote female education and empowerment through employment. The university encourages promotion of women in the organisation based on their merit and performance. This enables the university to ensure the implementation of gender equity strategies, including those for improving the representation of women in the university leadership positions and senior academic roles in the workplace environment of the university. The university also provides child-care facilities on campus and promotes workplace flexibility. JGU has been able to attract outstanding women academics, scholars and researchers as faculty members spread across all schools. Women are also well represented in leadership roles at JGU. As of 2022, this is evident in the number of women across the university in a range of functions – over 46 percent of our students and 49 percent faculty are women, and women hold 40 percent of leadership roles within the faculty, and 29 percent in non-teaching leadership roles, is has resulted through a conscious effort to recruit more women students and staff by JGU's admissions and outreach team, and human resources team. At JGU, we

record women's application rate, acceptance rate and degree completion rate. Our undergraduate student population consists of 48.7% female and 51.3% male students. Our postgraduate student population consists of 42.1% female and 57.9% male students. In the year 2023, 2049 out of 2076 (over 98%) students from all graduating batches successfully completed their degrees.



#### **SDG 6:** CLEAN WATER & SANITATION

ENSURE AVAILABILITY & SUSTAINABLE MANAGEMENT OF WATER AND SANITATION FOR ALL

The university ensures provision of free drinking water for students, staff and visitors. It also aims at developing management and guardianship plans for on-campus and surrounding waterways and on-campus biodiversity and ecosystems. The university has setup Reverse Osmosis (RO) plants on campus. This ensures that the drinking water goes through a thorough sanitation process for any consumption on campus. The university's Sewage Treatment Plants are also provided with ultraviolet and ultrafiltration facility so that the treated water can be used for cooling towers. This ensures sustainable management of water and sanitation for all on campus.



#### **SDG 7:** AFFORDABLE & CLEAN ENERGY

The university endeavours to decrease the dependency on conventional sources to zero and be self-sufficient on power generation versus utilisation. The university has created a sustainable model with solar power generation by contributing excess power to the grid. The university has aimed at instituting zero-net emission policies and investing in on-campus renewable energy production by developing long term resource efficiency and management plans.



#### **SDG 8:** DECENT WORK & ECONOMIC GROWTH

PROMOTE SUSTAINED, INCLUSIVE & SUSTAINABLE ECONOMIC GROWTH, FULL AND PRODUCTIVE EMPLOYMENT AND DECENT WORK FOR ALL

The university strives to nurture local employment by identifying local talent and nurture on national and international level, in areas of academics, leadership, cultural activities and sports. The university aims to align employment, training and regulation of policies to be consistent with its commitment to promoting equity and access. The university also endeavours to provide appropriately positioned and supported scholarship and financial assistance schemes for students in need which indeed supports creativity and innovation through a culture of acceptable risk-taking, providing the appropriate space and process for ideas to flourish. If any employee feels he or she is being subjected to discrimination, harassment, bullying or victimization, he or she can raise the same with the HR department or use the existing grievance redressal mechanisms like Anti-Discrimination Committee and Committee on Gender Sensitisation Against Sexual Harassment (COGSASH).

The university has also set up 3 Research Institutes and over 60 interdisciplinary research centres to engage in research that has a broad and global impact.

It also provides interdisciplinary education across other schools to ensure that there is adequate awareness on this important subject across the entire university.

The university follows environment friendly processes which do not have a negative impact on any water bodies or underground water systems. The university contributes to the goal of 'life on land' by having more than 55% of its campus area dedicated to flora and fauna. This includes a vast expanse of over nearly 8,000 trees and over 1,30,000 shrubs. With 78 species of trees and shrubs across the campus, the university has created a truly diverse and green campus.

The university on a regular basis arranges for free legal aid camps in which the university endeavours to provide free legal assistance and services to the underprivileged and the disadvantaged section of the society. involving all stakeholders and the students in the governance of the institution. JGU encourages student participation in campus governance. For this purpose, the university and students have set up democratically elected student (union) councils across all its 12 schools. The student council oversees academic, professional and personal development of the students individually and as a group, in order to achieve overall excellence.
